## 1. CALL TO ORDER:

Chair Sera called the regular meeting of the Parks, Recreation & Community Services Commission to order at 6:03 p.m. in the Council Chamber of Whittier City Hall, 13230 Penn Street, Whittier, California.

## 3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Westrup led the Pledge of Allegiance.

## 4. PUBLIC COMMENTS

No public comments were received.

## 5. STAFF REPORTS

## 5.A. Approval of Minutes

It was moved by Commissioner Givens, seconded by Vice Chair Pacheco, and carried 5-0 to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of September 18, 2024, with corrections. (Absent: Commissioner Mrla and Commissioner Hao).

## 5.B. Priorities and Implementation Guide

Secretary Santana presented the Priorities and Implementation Guide to the Commission. The guide includes a chart that reflects input from staff, the Commission, the community, and KTUA, as well as findings from recent park inspections. The chart organizes parks based on their amenity scores, ranked from lowest to highest. Kennedy Park, which received the lowest score, is currently undergoing renovations. Guirado Park, ranked second with a "Fair" rating, is also under construction. Using the park rankings, amenities assessments, and inspection results, the parks were prioritized as follows: Kennedy Park, Guirado Park, Broadway Park, J.G. Park (a smaller park now hosting programs like Movies in the Park), Joe Miller Field, Michigan Park, Murphy Ranch Park, Leffingwell Ranch Park, Founders Park, Central Park, Penn Park, Greenway Trail, York Field, Anaconda Park, Lee and Erika Owens Park, and Parnell Park (which was not ranked on the chart). This prioritization helps provide a clear framework for addressing park needs and future improvements.

Commissioner Givens inquired whether the list provided to the Commission ranked the parks by priority. Secretary Santana clarified that the list given to Commissioners is not organized by priority, but the chart displayed on the screen is prioritized accordingly. Commissioner Givens expressed concern about Leffingwell Ranch Park being rated lower in priority, especially since parks with more amenities and higher rankings were categorized as "Fair." She emphasized that Leffingwell Ranch Park, one of the few parks on the east side of Whittier, is not receiving the attention it deserves. The park's playground equipment is small and outdated. Her concern arose from its lower priority ranking compared to parks that are more modern and better equipped. In response, Secretary Santana acknowledged that Leffingwell Ranch Park should have received a lower rating to reflect a higher priority ranking. She assured the Commission that the chart would be revisited for further review.

Community Services Manager Hamilton noted that the Council could choose to prioritize parks with fewer amenities. She suggested that staff could prepare a secondary priority chart for Council's consideration, including recommendations for parks that have been less maintained and offer fewer amenities. Secretary Santana added that the chart could also be reorganized to include factors such as park acreage and size. Commissioner Givens highlighted that Leffingwell Ranch Park is located next to the YMCA, which uses its playground and pickleball courts for programming. She emphasized that additional investment in the park could attract more community members.

Chair Sera stated that the parks listed vary in features and amenities. He emphasized the importance of recognizing parks in poor condition and asked whether it would be possible to compare parks with differing amenities and features more effectively. He questioned the value of creating a general category that highlight parks that lack restrooms or have fewer than three or four amenities. He suggested that such a categorization could help the Council

quickly identify parks with the most and least resources and utilization. He continued that smaller parks should not be overlooked and recommended that staff update the list to better highlight parks with a full range of amenities and those with fewer resources. Secretary Santana acknowledged this suggestion and proposed organizing the chart by factors such as amenities, acreage, and size. She then asked the Commission if they would like to move the chart forward to Council or have it brought back to the Commission revised. Commissioner Givens suggested adding an addendum or remarks rather than redoing the entire chart. Secretary Santana agreed, stating that a comments column could be added for specific parks, along with details on acreage and size.

It was moved by Commissioner Apodaca, seconded by Chair Sera, and carried 5-0 to move the Priorities Implementation guide forward to Council with the inclusion of park size, acreage and comments for consideration. (Absent: Commissioner Mrla and Commissioner Hao).

## 6. SECRETARY'S COMMENTS

Secretary Santana shared the following updates:

- 10/26 we will host the Whittier Spooktacular 5K.
- 10/23 we will attend a Resource Fair at St. Mary's at 6:30 p.m. and hand out information on our programs like Dial-A-Ride and lunch program. Other city departments will be in attendance as well and share information with attendees.
- 11/11 we will host Veterans Day in front of City Hall and invite attendees to watch a documentary on Jose Ramos at the Whittier Theatre.
- 11/16 we will host Chalktastic in front of City Hall.
- 11/21 we will host a Harvest Feast at the Whittier Senior Center from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Please notify us if you would like to volunteer.
- The Ace Skate event has been postponed.

## 7. COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

Commissioner Givens thanked staff for compiling the chart and incorporating the various suggestions.

Commissioner Westrup thanked staff for organizing the upcoming events. He inquired about the start times for the Resource Fair at St. Mary's and Chalktastic. Secretary Santana confirmed the Resource Fair would begin at 6:30 p.m., while Management Analyst Arismendez noted that Chalktastic would start at 9:00 a.m. Commissioner Westrup then asked about the Harvest Feast, and it was confirmed it would begin at 11:00 a.m., with opportunities for volunteers to help serve food and escort seniors.

Commissioner Apodaca thanked staff for their efforts in organizing the chart and upcoming events. She acknowledged the importance of the inspections that were conducted at the parks and for taking into consideration the conditions of the amenities.

Vice Chair Pacheco recognized the difficulty of creating an amenities chart given the varying sizes and features of the parks. She commended staff for incorporating community and Commission feedback, which is evident when reviewing the chart.

Chair Sera acknowledged the significant progress made. He thanked staff and KTUA for their collaborative efforts in sorting through the information and suggestions.

## **BACKGROUND**

The Project includes site modifications, including block walls, lighting, landscaping, irrigation, parking lot rehabilitation, and several ADA improvements. Additionally, Guirado Park will include new basketball courts and fitness equipment with a rubberized surface.

On March 28, 2023, City Council approved the professional services agreement with TAIT and Associates, Inc., to provide engineering design services to develop construction bid documents for Kennedy Park and Guirado Park Improvements.

On June 25, 2024, the City Council approved the plans and specifications and authorized the advertisement for construction bids for the Project. The council also approved the purchase of fitness equipment from Greenfields Outdoor Fitness, Inc. for Guirado Park.

On July 25, 2024, the City received five bids, with Caliba, Inc. submitting the lowest bid.

On August 13, 2024, City Council adopted Resolution No. 2024-48, amending the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budget with an appropriation for the Kennedy Park & Guirado Park Improvements Project awarded to Caliba, Inc.

## **DISCUSSION**

The projects are moving forward as scheduled. Guirado Park is nearing completion, with the painting of the basketball courts and other minor punch list items to complete. Kennedy Park has been met with some underground irrigation issues, but they are correcting and making great strides. The large wall adjacent to the homes at Kennedy Park has been installed, and the parking lot is coming together. Attached (attachment A) are photos of the progress made at both project locations.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Approve Special Event Permit Application from Shelter's Right Hand for its "Stepping Out Against Domestic Violence" 5k Walk on April 26, 2025.

## **BACKGROUND**

The Shelter's Right Hand, as the auxiliary to the Women's and Children's Crisis Shelter (WCCS), has been able to provide a haven and critical emergency and support services to families in our community. Women, men, and their children are finding their way out of the nightmare of violence and into a shelter that offers safety, shelter, and hope. In their 43<sup>rd</sup> year, they are once again hosting their annual 5k WALK "Stepping Out Against Domestic Violence."

## DISCUSSION

The Shelter's Right Hand requests additional support from the City, which has not been approved in past permits. These new requests are as follows:

- 1. Street Closure: between Washington Avenue and Friends Avenue from 5:00 AM to 11:00 AM. (6hrs) No Parking signs the day before will need to be posted.
- 2. Fee Waiver Request for the added street closure request: Parks, Recreation & Community Services Staff Cost: \$259. (two staff at \$18.50 x 7 hours)
- 3. Parking Accessibility: Request that the parking structures on Bright and Comstock open early to accommodate participants.

The Shelter's Right Hand has many volunteers to oversee this wonderful event and will be paying for additional restrooms and trash cans needed for the growing number of participants they are expecting. The event continues to grow, and street closure has become necessary for safety reasons.

## FISCAL IMPACT

The Shelter's Right Hand requests that the estimated staffing cost of \$259 from the Parks, Recreation, and Community Services Department be waived.

Shelter's Right Hand is in its 42nd year as the non-profit, fundraising auxiliary to the Women's and Children's Crisis Shelter, Inc., (WCCS). Since 1978 WCCS has provided temporary shelter and support services for victims of domestic violence in our local community and the southeast area of Los Angeles County.

Shelter's Right Hand is holding its 29th annual "Stepping Out Against Domestic Violence" 5K Walk to benefit **Wees** on Saturday, April 26, 2025. The monies raised from the Walk support the maintenance and operations of the shelter's emergency program.

Please find attached a Special Event Permit Application for use of Central Park in Uptown Whittier. The request is for the starting and ending point of the 5K Walk. The Walk registration begins at 6:30 a.m. Following a warm-up and welcome at the park gazebo, the Walk will begin at about 8:00 a.m., coursing a 3.1-mile route through the business and historic residential districts of Uptown Whittier. Participants return to the park for refreshments and the awarding of prizes. The event usually concludes by 11:00 a.m. The estimated attendance at the Walk is 600 to 700.

As in the past, we are requesting permission for amplified sound at the event. Amplified sound from the Central Park gazebo would be used only for about 60 minutes, from 7:15 a.m. to 8:15 a.m. We would ask that the electricity by the gazebo be turned on by the City before 7:15 a.m. and that the bathrooms be open by 6:30 a.m. Hopefully, this arrangement will again be acceptable for the upcoming Walk. We do not require the need of any other City services.

Advertising for the Walk is done by direct mail, email, street banners on Greenleaf Ave., local newspapers, Channel 6, storefront posters, flyers, our website, and the **Wees** website. In addition, we will be using a variety of social media to advertise. Since we will begin advertising the Walk in October, we appreciate knowing if our application has been approved as soon as possible.

I am following up on our December 4, 2024, submission and meeting with Virginia and Erin, I'd like to provide additional details regarding our upcoming Shelter's Right Hand Stepping Out Against Domestic Violence 5K Walk to be held on Saturday, April 26, 2025, at Central Park in Uptown Whittier and kindly request your assistance in ensuring its success.

As our event has grown significantly since last year, we are requesting the following support from the city:

- 1. **Street Closure:** We kindly ask the city staff to close the street between Washington and Friends from 5:00 AM to 11:00 AM to ensure pedestrian safety and prevent accidents. This would require barricades and city staff (working in shifts) to monitor both ends of the street. A map is included for reference.
- 2. **Fee Waiver Request:** As this is our first time requesting a street closure, we respectfully request a waiver of the associated fees. Given the long-standing partnership between the city and the SRH 5K Walk, we believe this request aligns with our shared goal of supporting community events that benefit residents.
- 3. **Restroom Facilities:** We plan to provide two to three portable restrooms in the enclosed area to accommodate our walkers.
- 4. **Trash Collection:** We will place a medium-sized roll-away trash bin in the enclosed area for centralized waste collection, arranged through Athens.
- 5. **Parking Accessibility:** We request that the parking structures on Bright and Comstock remain open to accommodate participants.
- 6. **Power Box Inspection:** We ask for the power box in the area to be inspected 2-3 weeks prior to the event to ensure it is in proper working order and to avoid any outages or malfunctions.

We deeply appreciate the city's support in helping us host a safe and successful event. We are confident that our Walk will continue to foster community engagement and promote a positive impact on our residents.



- (iii) Any risk retention group; or
- (iv) Any self-insurance method or program, in which case the insured will be deemed to be the provider of other insurance.

Other insurance does not include umbrella insurance, or excess insurance, that was bought specifically to apply in excess of the Limits of Insurance shown in the Declarations of this Coverage Part.

As used anywhere in this Coverage Part, other insurer means a provider of other insurance. As used in Paragraph c. below, insurer means a provider of insurance.
