Subject: Philadelphia Project Request for Proposal Submissions

RECOMMENDATION

Review and select three to five artist proposals for the Philadelphia Art Project for further review by the Cultural Arts Commission.

BACKGROUND

The Art in Public Places (AIPP) committee selected the site for the newest public art project to be located at the corner of Philadelphia Street and Whittier Boulevard across from the entrance to The Groves. It is worth noting that two blocks east of this site is the home of our Solar Tree art piece, which was dedicated in 2019.

At the May 22, 2024, meeting, the AIPP Committee approved the updated changes to the Request for Proposal (RFP) and recommended it for review by the Cultural Arts Commission (CAC). On June 24, 2024, the CAC recommended the Request for Proposal to City Council with the inclusion of language encouraging local artists to apply.

At its meeting on January 28, 2025, the City Council approved the RFP for an Art in Public Places project at Whittier Boulevard and Philadelphia Street and allocated \$250,000 of AIPP funding for the project.

DISCUSSION

The RFP was issued on March 3, 2025. Proposals were due to the Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Services Department (PRCS) by May 2nd. The department received 19 proposals from a variety of artists (Attachment A). All submissions were forwarded to individual committee members on May 16th for initial review in preparation of a full-committee discussion.

The Committee will discuss proposals with the intention of shortlisting three to five of the proposals to the Cultural Arts Commission for a second round of review before a recommendation is made to the City Council regarding a final selection.
